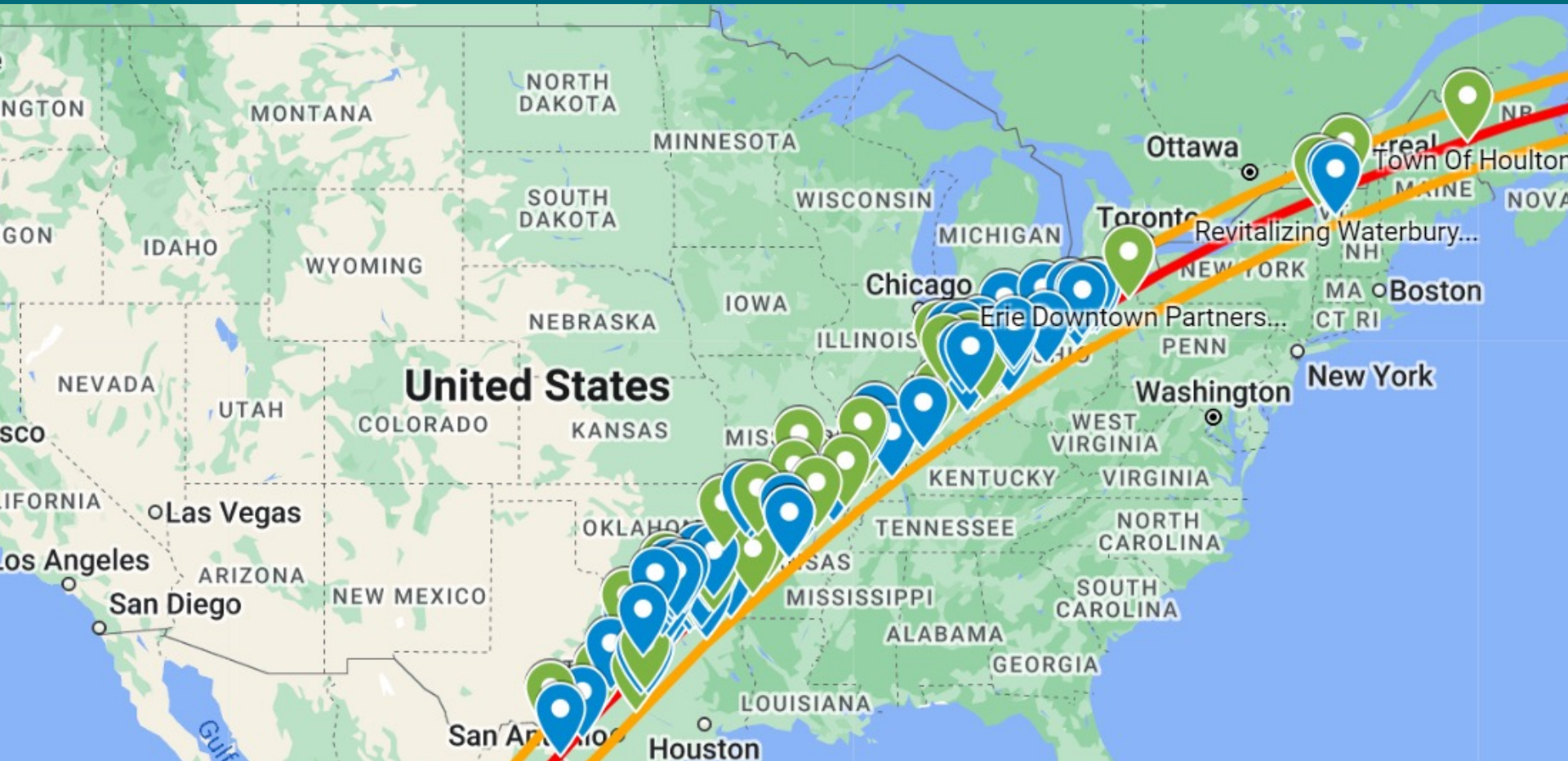

Carbondale, Ill., was the point of longest duration for the 2017 total solar eclipse. For almost three minutes, the town was wrapped in total darkness in the middle of a late-summer day. Those three minutes attracted an estimated 30,000 visitors from all over the world to the town of just over 20,000, with hotels booked with a three-day minimum. They played host to scientists, professors, and curiosity-seekers from around the world – including a visit and live broadcast from NASA.

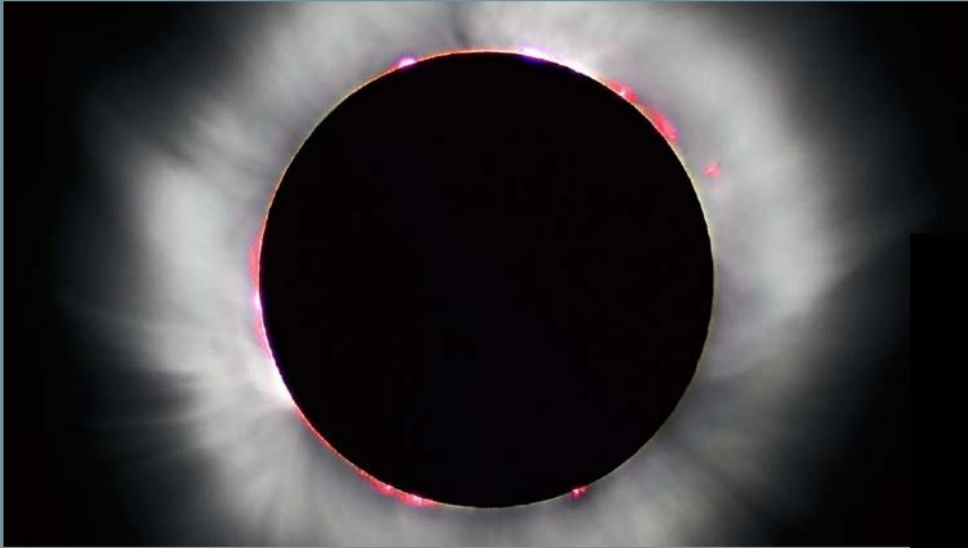
